With its vision to become the center of excellence among institutions of higher learning, Jose Rizal Memorial State University (JRMSU) is dynamically and consciously applying for various strategies and techniques to cope with the ever changing demands of the society and to maintain its excellent performance in academic endeavor. It is a big challenge for the University to accommodate the needs of Zamboanga del Norte and neighboring provinces by providing competent graduates capable of embarking development to their working places.

The University, with the capacity to provide quality and relevant higher and advanced education in various fields, offers 3 doctorate degree programs, 18 master's degree programs, 50 bachelor's degree programs, 10 non-degree programs, 15 short-term courses and corporate high school. Advanced education programs are on the fields of education, public administration and management, rural development, health and nursing, arts and sciences, criminology, technological and vocational education and agriculture courses. On the other hand, higher education focuses on the fields of engineering, arts and sciences, criminology, industrial and information technology, teacher education, agriculture, forestry and fishery, maritime education, tourism, hotel and restaurant management, nursing and allied health sciences, public and business administration, commerce and accountancy, law, nontraditional courses and other relevant fields of study.

To ensure quality and responsive education that is comparable to the national and international standards, curricular programs of the University have been submitted for accreditation through the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACUP) and International Standardization Organization (ISO) 9001 : 2008 for the College of Maritime Education courses. Technical-vocational courses have been also given National Certificate (NC) II by the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority. The University has 12 AACUP accredited programs, 2 ISO accredited programs, and 15 TESDA accredited technical-vocational courses.

The fact that students in the University have diversities on skills and interests, addressing and attending their needs require much competence on the part of instructors / professors. In order to uphold quality and excellence in service delivery, University has fervently and unwaveringly provided opportunities for its faculty to be abreast of their fields by attending conferences, seminars and trainings and enrolling in advanced studies. The product of this strong motivation is evidenced by the remarkable performance ratings beyond national passing percentage in board examinations given by the Professional Regulation Commission.

The College of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences has proved its excellence when one of its students ranked number 6 in the whole Philippines in Midwifery



board examination. Another evidence of this effort is apparent in the achievements of students in academic and extra-curricular activities which most of them obtained the regional and national awards.

These significant achievements paved the way to government and private agencies in Zamboanga del Norte and neighboring provinces to entrust the holistic development of their scholars in the University. This School Year 2011-2012, the number of deserving students enjoying scholarships reaches up to 1300.

It can be gleaned in the table that Tampilisan Campus decreased in both semesters during the SY 2012-2013 at 5% and 3.62% respectively, compared to the previous school year. Dapitan Campus also has decreased enrolment during the second semester of the SY 2012-2013 at 6.03% but it showed a highest enrolment increase during the first semester of SY 2012-2013 at 36.01%. This great percentage increase is attributed to the enrollees from BS in Marine Transportation and BS in Marine Engineering consortium from Negros Oriental State University.




Figure 2 Difference of Student Enrolment between First Semester of SY 2011-2012 and First Semester of SY 2012-2013




Figure 3 Difference of Student Enrolment between Second Semester of SY 2011-2012 and Second Semester of SY 2012-2013

RESEARCH SERVICES

Jose Rizal Memorial State University (JRMSU) researchers have expanded the frontiers of knowledge and contributed to the material, social, and cultural well-being of Zamboanga del Norte and the Philippines as a whole. And as a University, JRMSU continues its venture of producing quality researches and expanding its experiences with the global trends in research. Researches have been presented in local, national and international research fora, symposia and conferences and published in local, national and international peer-refereed and indexed journals to disseminate and contribute significant findings within and across national borders.

The Ecology, Genetic and Restocking of Giant Clams: A Strategy of Strengthening Marine Conservation and Management of Marine Protected Areas around East Nusa Tenggara Province is in its fourth year of implementation and the University is one of its implementer. Funding agencies have already noted the quality



of research outputs that the University has produced. The Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources has still its trust to the University in the implementation of the Aquasilviculture Project in the province. Even the Department of Agrarian Reform noted the research capability of the University by entrusting its assessment projects in order to have smooth flow and successful implementation of its programs.

RESEARCH OUTPUTS AND PRESENTATION

This year, the University maintained its outstanding performance in research. The University conducted researches not for the sole purpose of compliance but for the reason of serving the community by disseminating meaningful findings and contributing new knowledge and practices for the development of local, national and international communities. The dissemination of findings is done by presenting research papers during local, national and international conferences where researchers, educators, policy makers, community workers and other interested people convene. These people, who are actively involved in conferences in turn, conducted seminars and trainings for the benefit of the community as a result of newly acquired information and practices in specific fields.

The University has presented 15 researches in the international conferences, 36 in the national presentations, and 66 in the local presentations specifically SUCRED In-haus Review.

ON-GOING AND FUNDED RESEARCHES

JRMSU is on its second year as implementer of the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) Aquasilviculture project. It aims to ensure resource sustainability, attain food security and alleviate poverty among Filipinos who are known to depend on the country's coastal resources. Universitas Kristen Artha Wacana (UKAW), Kupang, Indonesia still partnered the institution in the implementation of the research project entitled, "*Ecology, Genetic and Restocking of Giant Clams: A Strategy of Strengthening Marine Conservation and Management of Marine Protected Areas around East Nusa Tenggara Province*" and now on its fourth year. Recently, the Department of Agrarian Reform trusted the institution as the implementer and consultant in three assessment projects necessary for the smooth implementation of its programs. Other research projects depicted below were funded by the institution.

Cultured *Hippopus hippopus* and *Tridacna squamosa* were placed on coral rubbles (Figure 1) before they were restocked in Tabulong and Bolok reefs in coordination with the local government unit of Tabulong and BBIP (Figure 2). Cages (dimension: 1m x 0.7m x 0.3m) were made using steel bars and PE net (Figure 3).

A total of 1000 juveniles were deployed in Tablong and Bolok reefs which included 191, one-year old *Hippopus hippopus* (37.17 ± 6.62 mm) and 801 three-month old *T. squamosa* (3.75 ± 0.95 mm) individuals on November 19, 2012 (Figures 4-5).

EXTENSION SERVICES AND LINKAGES

Jose Rizal Memorial State University, as a determined institution in developing communities holistically, implemented extension programs and services targeting the economic, social, emotional, educational, and physical needs of these communities. Each College of the University is mandated to implement at least one extension program every semester. Extension programs and services have been conducted in research-driven and community need-based practices. These are implemented according to the capacity of the college to deliver them effectively.

Extension, aside from its being mandatory to the University, has been performed as part of the responsibilities of every faculty as an educated individual that his/her capabilities must be extended to the communities where his/her skills are most needed. The University is also maximizing its partnership to local, regional and national government line agencies and private sectors to strengthen its full-force extension workers and extend its geographical reach of adopting communities. This school year there are over forty (40) linkages that the University has strengthened. Coordinating with government line agencies and private sectors which have direct control to most of the communities, enables the University to widen its opportunity of rendering extension programs and services not only to its vicinity but also even beyond its area of responsibility.

Due to the known active services that the University can offer, it gained trust from the communities and invited external funding agencies to support its extension programs. As a result, it extended the services even beyond the sphere of its influence. In Iligan City for example, the University did not hesitate to plant hope and build communities to the victims of typhoon Sendong by actively and dedicatedly joining the Bayani Challenge: *Pilipinas Ngayon Na!* Almost all extension programs are ventured for poverty reduction of the people in Zamboanga del Norte. The implementation of these programs have been fortified in partnership with DOLE, DTI, DOST, DILG, DDPKaRoMa, LGSP - LED, DA, BFAR, PGO, DENR, TESDA, FIDA, DAR and PCA.

RECOGNIZED EXTENSION PROGRAMS

The University with its commitment to deliver research and demand-driven extension programs for the benefit of the community through literacy program, values formation, livelihood training, health and sanitation, and environmental seminars, has truly gained public trust. PRODUCTION

To augment the budget allocation of government for higher education, the Commission on Higher Education has encouraged State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) to engage in income generating projects (IGPs). In response, Dr. Edgar S. Balbuena, JRMSU University President, challenged the five (5) campuses of the University to maximize their available resource for sustainable IGPs. He also persuaded researchers to make researches for commercialization as another means of increasing the University's income.

Income generating projects has been beneficial for a long time to the University in cases where it's a necessity to source out fund from other reliable sources aside from the subsidy of the government to realize instructional and physical development; to expand and strengthen research and extension undertakings and to wage; and to compensate contract laborers. Likewise, IGPs serve as hands-on trainings for students to make connections between theories learned in school e.g. those with agricultural courses where fields are laboratories for crop productions; and enhance entrepreneurial skills of those with business related courses.



INCOME GENERATING PROJECT (IGP)

Each campus is adopting strategies and applying entrepreneurial abilities to efficiently derive higher income from its resources. In the Main Campus, IGPs focused on students' system uniform, t-shirts, faculty uniform, sardine production, water refilling station, kiosk, guest house rental and toga rental. Dipolog Campus on the other hand, has only two IGPs namely, cafeteria, water refilling station, rent of gymnasium, metal work service, and catering service. Siocon Campus obtained its income from rice production, bangus and fry production, academic gown rental and system uniform. Katipunan Campus has IGPs focusing on dormitory and function hall rentals, rice, vegetables and fruit production, poultry and livestock raising, piggery, dairy products, food processing, and catering services,

Through the linkages of Tampilisan Campus with different NGOs and GOs as lead agencies for rice production and vermi-composting projects (vermicast/vermitea) has provided venues for IGPs capabilities towards the production of rice seeds and organic fertilizers in commercial level. Aside from this new project, the campus has maintained its income from bamboo, cattle/dairy project, ZREC, fruit trees, vegetable nursery, piggery project, poultry project, rubber production, rice production, sheep, computer printing, coconut project, sand and gravel/quarry, chicken multiplier farm, hito/tilapia production, and vermi culture.
